

LAMPP will provide the following to owners:

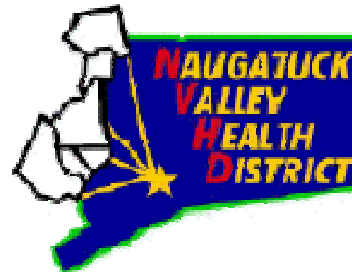
- Financial assistance to landlord to control lead hazards and improve property.
- Assistance with any needed temporary relocation.
- Education on lead poisoning and prevention.
- Risk assessment of property to check for lead hazards.
- Plans to control lead hazards found on the property.

The owner agrees to the following:

- Give rental priority to families with children under six years of age for a period of 3 years.
- Maintain the units in accordance with federal Housing Quality Standard for 3 years.
- Maintain affordable rent levels (HUD Existing Fair Market Rent) for 3 years.
- Rent units to low-income households as defined by HUD for a period of 3 years.

Do you own or rent a home in Ansonia?



- Was the residential property built **prior to 1978**?
- Do children **under six years** of age reside at the property?
- Has the child been tested for lead exposure?
- Is the blood lead level **10-19ug/dl**?

If you answered yes to all of these questions, you may be eligible for **LAMPP**.

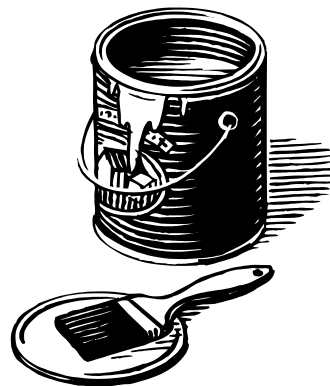
What is LAMPP?

LAMPP or **Lead Action for Medicaid Primary Prevention** is an early intervention and preventive program to reduce lead hazards for Medicaid enrolled and other low-income children under six years of age.

The aim is to protect children at lower blood lead levels and prevent exposure to children occupying the same housing in future years.

FACTS ABOUT LEAD PAINT

- Most homes built before 1978 contain lead-based paint.
- Most children are poisoned by lead dust that is released when paint is peeling, damaged or disturbed.
- Children under age six are most at risk.
- Lead can lead to lifelong learning and behavioral problems.
- Pregnant women exposed to lead can harm their unborn baby.
- Lead can be found in paint, dust, soil and water.



LAMPP will provide the following to families:

- Education on lead poisoning and prevention.
- Risk assessment to check your home for lead hazards.
- Plans to control lead hazards found in your home.
- Assistance in temporary relocation during construction.

The family agrees to the following:

- Allowing LAMPP to check home for lead hazards.
- Getting children under six years of age tested for blood lead levels.
