Advanced Extrication Scenarios

Pre-requisite for admission: Hydraulic rescue tool training, pneumatic air bag training and some experience with stabilizing struts and proper stabilizing/shoring procedures.

Class Schedule: The day will be broken into 30 minutes of introductory classroom time, 3- 2 ½ hour hands on advanced extrication scenarios and will finish with another 30 minutes of closing discussion and course evaluations.

Extrication Scenarios: The student will be exposed to 3 separate extrication situations throughout the course of the day. Each scenario will last approximately 2 ½ hours, with 2 separate extrication events taking place at each station (75 minutes each). Your company will be expected to safely and efficiently rescue the trapped occupant/occupants within the **“GOLDEN HOUR”**

Vehicle into the water: Your company is dispatched to the report of a vehicle off the road into a small river, upside down with confirmed entrapment. The vehicle is located in approximately 30 inches of water off the side of the road.

Highway entrapment involving a jersey barrier: Your company is dispatched to the report of a multiple vehicle accident on I-95, with a multi car accident and confirmed entrapment with a vehicle on its side into the barrier.



Highway entrapment involving a vehicle under a tractor trailer: Your company is dispatched to the report of a motor vehicle accident on I-95 involving a vehicle reported to be under the rear of a tractor trailer with confirmed entrapment.

Vendors Attending this event: Firematic Supply, Shipmans Fire Equipment, Paratech, Hurst, Holmatro, Rescue Jack, and a few others. This will give the student the ability to use new equipment on the market that can be applied to each of the scenarios.
